TCSD Upper Salinas River Basin Conjunctive Use Project (US-CUP)
East Side Force Main and Lift Stations (ESFM) Project Construction

The US-CUP Project is complete. Staff received confirmation of approval of the CWSRF Funding Disbursement request in the amount of \$2,815,570 and the final loan forgiveness amount was approved at \$1,440,134, increasing the total amount of combined grant and loan forgiveness funding to \$4,396,930 of the \$8,023,291 cost.

Work closing out the project will continue over the next several months.

Meadowbrook WWTP Operations and Maintenance

The East Side Force Main and Lift Stations Project has been fully operational since the end of June 2019. The increased flow impacts the operations of both the treatment pond system and the land disposal/percolation system. Both operations now require significantly more active management. Higher strength wastewater is being received from the newly added east side flow and the purchase of 4 aerators is recommended to aid treatment and add flexibility to the WWTP treatment pond system; see related business item on the April 7, 2020 Agenda. Staff is also continuing to work with consultants and vendors to develop recommendations for additional necessary future wastewater improvements. Source control outreach to the craft wine, beer and related businesses will continue with the exception of on-site visits, which are temporarily on hold during the COVID-19 emergency shelter in-home order. While the District continues to implement these items, staff is working on a parallel path to improve the filtration quality of the treated wastewater discharge to the Selby percolation ponds.

Misc. Engineering Updates/Activities

- In addition to the District Facilities related activities described above, the District continues to receive and respond to will serve letter requests, and requests on potential projects with the District. However, the activity has significantly decreased.
