Significant Incident(s):

On 5/18/22 at approximately 05:35, TFD was dispatched to the report of a structure fire at 31 Sunnyside Way. Chief 7100, Engine 7190, SLO County Engine 30, Atascadero Engine 7591, Paso Robles Engine 8191 and SLO County Battalion 3415 were all assigned. Chief 7100 was the first unit to arrive and reported a single-family residence with a fully involved living room and fire venting from the windows, 7100 assumed Sunny IC. 7190 arrived and was assigned Fire Attack. 7190 initially deployed a hose line

with one firefighter and applied water from the exterior of the structure until the next arriving unit could supply personnel. IC confirmed all occupants were out of the structure but, did confirm 3 dogs and one cat were still inside. SLO County Engine 30 arrived on scene and supplied 7190. After supplying 7190 with water Engine 30 joined the firefighter from 7190 to prepare for interior attack. Paso Robles Engine 8191 arrived on scene and was assigned to Division "C", the back side of the structure. At this time the majority of the first floor was fully involved in fire. SLO County Battalion 3415 arrived on scene and was assigned Incident Safety. Off Duty Engineer Baker arrived on scene and took over pumping of Engine 7190. Fire Attack began to make their interior fire attack in conjunction with Division "C". Atascadero Engine 7591 arrived on scene and was assigned to Division "C". Fire crews began to achieve significant success in extinguishment. At approximately 06:22 IC reported the fire contained. After a significant amount of overhaul IC released Engine 8191 and Engine 7591. At approximately 06:33 crews determined there was a small flare up in a hidden void space adjacent to the second-floor bedroom. This was located as a result of starting positive pressure ventilation to clear the structure for investigation purposes. The fire built in the void space and entered the garage attic. At this time on scene crews reinitiated a fire attack and began additional overhaul operation in the closet of the second-floor bedroom. Due to the fatigue of the on-scene crews the IC requested one engine back to the scene from Paso Robles Fire. The fire was nearly extinguished when the Paso Engine 8191 arrived. IC directed 8191 crew to conduct additional interior overhaul in the second-floor bedroom closet. After approximately 45 minutes the flare up was completely extinguished. During this period investigators from SLOFIST started their investigation. Refer to the investigation report for cause determination. At approximately 10:11 IC released all remaining units and terminated command.



On 6/7/22 at approximately 15:44, TFD was dispatched to the report of a 2nd alarm structure fire in the City of Paso Robles. E7190 Responded on a mutual aid request. On arrival E7190 was assigned to checked for extension in the garage to ensure no fire had reached the attic space. Upon completion of this assignment E7190 went into rehab and was then released from the incident.

On 6/11/22 at approximately 19:02, Engine 7160 responded to Atascadero for reported vegetation fire. Upon arrival E7160 was assigned to the right flank of the fire and tasked with extinguishing some spot fires and assist with putting in a scratch line. Engine 7160 completed the assignment and returned to station 71.
